Prof. Mostafa Gad (Speaker) is a Professor at High Institute of Folk Arts - Academy of Arts- Egypt, specialized in the documentation of intangible heritage. Prof. Gad was the ex-Dean of the institute and has published 12 Books as well as more than 85 articles and studies in Arabic and European magazines since 1987 until now. Prof. Gad has been awarded the ALECSO Prize for the intangible heritage in 2014. He is also a key member in many national and international organizations interested in heritage and documentation. He is also a member of the Train-The-Trainers' facilitators of UNESCO – Paris.

Mrs. Ahlam Abouzeid (Exhibitor) is an expert in the domain of Intangible Cultural Heritage (Folklore). She is Former Director of Center of Folklore studies - Academy of Arts. Mrs Abouzeid organized a number of international exhibitions on Egyptian traditional crafts. She has also published studies about traditional crafts, customs and traditions and trained many Arabic researchers in surveying and gathering of data on intangible heritage. She is a regular writer in the Bahrainian folk-culture magazine.
