After his graduation as an architectural engineer, Ahmad Hamid collaborated with Hassan Fathy at the Institute of Appropriate Technology while participating in the design team with Skidmore Owings & Merrill for the World Trade Centre Cairo. He was one of an international group of consultants involved in the urban planning and architecture for Sadat City Egypt. He founded AHMAD HAMID ARCHITECTS as an interdisciplinary office in Cairo 1984, and since then has been an advocate of the idea of intelligent, delightful form across a wide spectrum ranging from urban planning to special limited-edition perfume fragrances. He further pursued post graduate studies in Islamic art and architecture, whose principles inspire a great deal of his work.

Ahmad Hamid has worked as a design consultant in Germany, England, Switzerland, Malaysia, Syria, Saudi Arabia, Oman, and Abu Dhabi. Over 100 articles in 10 different languages have been written about his work. He is the author of: Hassan Fathy. Continuity in Islamic Art & Architecture: The Birth of a New Modern, published by AUC Press in 2010.
